## A Rosy Future For Domenic



To see Domenic today, you would never believe what he looked like a few short months ago. The charismatic black and white feline first came to the attention of the Fraser Valley Humane Society when a young man from Silverdale phoned to say he had found a stray, injured cat and wanted to help.

Christine Reed, Executive Director of the FVHS, knew that the shelter was full and the vet bills were

piling up. So she attempted to determine if the cat was in an immediate need of care. She asked if the cat was eating, drinking and using his box. The young man confirmed that he was so Christine told him to bring the cat in the next day.

When they arrived, Christine was shocked at what she saw. The little cat appeared to be missing half of his face! It was as if it had been ripped away, yet this plucky boy was going about life normally. She immediately put him in her car and rushed to the vet. A few minutes down the road she noticed a terrible smell so strong that she had to roll down her window and stick her head outside to breathe. Staff at Mission Veterinary Clinic dubbed him, affectionately, “Peppy Le Pew.”

The vet determined that the cat had likely been attacked by something but it was an infection that had slowly eaten away his face. After tending and cleaning his wounds the next order of business was to get him neutered since hormonal changes that occur when a male cat is fixed cause the skin to become looser.

### FVHS Mission Statement

The Fraser Valley Humane Society (FVHS) is a non-profit organization comprised of staff and volunteers dedicated to the operation of a no kill shelter in Mission, BC. The FVHS works within the community, eliminating needless suffering of stray domestic animals. While we provide assistance in finding all abandoned animals loving and responsible homes, we mainly focus our efforts on the feline population. We are a limited admission shelter that provides an alternative to euthanasia through programs that manage population control. Together we will effect social change!



In October, I had the honor of being nominated for Shelter director of the year at the Banff Summit for Urban Animal Strategies. There were 80 delegates who attended by invitation only.

My biggest concern was taking time away from the adoption center. But the opportunity to attend a meeting of shelter managers, veterinarians and other pet care professionals from across Canada and the US was too great to miss. I knew it would provide me with a huge opportunity to network and learn from the leaders in animal welfare.

It was a frenetic and enlightening two days. What a pleasure it was to get together with others dedicated to animal welfare. Most of the attendees were impressed and astonished with what we have accomplished here in Mission with so little funding. They were shocked to learn that our volunteers spend countless hours fundraising to provide what is an essential community service.

The Fraser Valley Humane Society was also nominated for business of the year by the Mission Chamber of Commerce. These recognitions demonstrate how our hard work is being noticed.

### **Mission failing to Spay and neuter**

A disturbing phenomenon is occurring in Mission again this year. Frequently, staff at the FVHS adoption center are fielding calls from out of towners looking for kittens to adopt.

people are coming from places as far away as North Vancouver, White Rock, Bellevue Washington and even the Yukon! They are looking here because they can't find kittens in their own communities.

This suggests that without a properly funded spay and neuter program, Mission is falling behind in its responsibility to control cat populations. This essential community service can only be accomplished with consistent support dedicated for that purpose.

365 days of the year, the FVHS cares for the cats of our community. We take in strays and surrenders whenever we can, we treat illnesses and injuries, we vaccinate and neuter, and then we find suitable homes. This has sharply reduced the incidence of disease and suffering of Mission cats. It is also an enormous task.

Although the FVHS only adopts cats and kittens after they have been spayed, people who acquire kittens from other sources are not always getting their new cats altered. In a very short time they are overwhelmed with more cats that eventually find their way to us.

In addition, numerous cats end up at the shelter after their owners have moved away. These people have decided that it is easier to abandon their pets than to fulfill their responsibility to provide for their care.

Sadly, we only hear of these abandoned pets when concerned neighbors hear their anxious cries or find them searching in vain for their family. These animals are left confused and helpless.

Currently, we are providing this service with the limited money we take in at fundraising events. This year we hope to receive an increase in funding from the city of Mission for our important community role.

With more consistent funds, we might finally reduce the steady influx of kittens to our shelter each year.

# Volunteers make it happen!



Bruce (Bud) Smith, is one of the FVHS most dedicated volunteers. We, asked his wife, Joyce (pictured with Bud) about his dedication to others in need.

Bud has always loved animals and that was one of the endearing things that attracted me to him. When we got married in 1966 and headed towards 100 Mile House for our honeymoon, the sign in the back read: CAT-ASTOPHE!

At one time, we had an SPCA in Mission and we were both

members, but the SPCA decided to pull out of Mission leaving hundreds of animals at risk. In the fall of 1997, my cousin brought us a litter of four, three day old kittens. With the help of Rosemary Morgan, a lady we met through the SPCA, we hand raised them. This experience inspired us to do more and as time went on the three of us continued to take in cats and kittens of all ages.

The following Thanksgiving weekend, Bud and I got a call asking if we would help rescue a black lab and her two 6 week old puppies. The mom and her babies were emaciated and full of worms.

Sadly, one of the pups, named Buster Brown, died of Parvo. Everyone involved in the rescue of the puppies were devastated. Then we decided to honor this brave fellow by organizing ourselves into The Buster

## Brown Care Group.

Bud worked full time in Vancouver. He started his commute from Mission at 4:00 am and didn't get home until 6:00 pm. Despite this, Bud was the one who provided the comfort and calm when things did not go as planned.

He never once refused to accept another animal to our home. He never once begrudged working long hours to help with the extra costs of rescuing animals. He never complained about the furniture being destroyed or having to move 10 cats off the bed before he could crawl in and get a little sleep himself.

Bud helped mix formula, bottle feed the kittens, cuddled them, changed their litter pans, delivered cats to the vets and picked up medications. He held me tight in his strong arms when I needed reassurance. He provided a shoulder to cry on when I needed it the most. Without his silent strength, The Buster Brown Care Group would not have survived to help so many animals.

Bud worked for the city of Vancouver and helped a skunk, several squirrels, many birds and even a rat or two. He often got laughed at by co-workers but Bud just took it in stride and did whatever he could to help the animals.

In 1999, the Fraser Valley Humane society was formed. Buster Brown Care Group decided to 'fold up' and put all of our energy into supporting the FVHS.

I lived with my human companion until he passed away. No one in the family wanted to keep me so I'm back here at the FVHS adoption center. Come check me out!



We held a huge Christmas fundraiser in our home to make the transition. Bud took a week of his holidays to prepare our house for this special occasion.

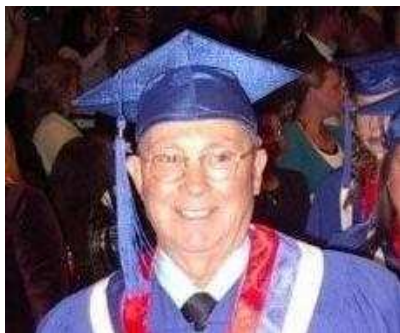

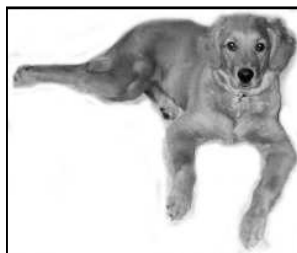
Since my elderly mother-in-law was ill and lonely during the days we were all at work or school, my son decided that we needed a dog to keep her company.
